Primary School Sports Funding 2014-15

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; that we increase the number of children participating in sport in our school.

At Fairmeadows Foundation Primary School we have developed an action plan in order to continue to provide sustained improvement in PE provision, increase levels of involvement in sporting activities and raise achievement for all pupils in PE.

Our priorities mean that the funding for 2014-15 will be used to:

- Enhance the choice of after schools clubs which we offer to all age groups.
- Train staff on the balance ability programme.
- Develop staff expertise in teaching, through providing additional training and professional development, and the use of multi leaders coaching.
- Further increase levels of activity provided during Lunch Breaks through provision of the training, resources, activities and employment of an Activity Leader.
- Further increase pupils' participation in physical activity through the development of inclusive competitive opportunities, including intra and inter school competitions
- Further increase pupils' participation in district and county-wide competitions and tournaments through membership of the local sports partnership.

Sustainability

We will endeavour to use the funding to make high quality PE and sport sustainable. Our CPD programme and utilising coaches who have links to local clubs to provide further participation opportunities beyond the school day will help achieve this.
